Registration Levels

- Individual & Family: \$35 per sailor (\$100 Maximum Per Boat plus additional insurance fees)
- Small Business/Non-Profit: \$100/Boat plus additional insurance fees
- Corporate: \$175/Boat plus additional insurance fees

Boat Classes

- Pre-Built Cardboard
- Built on site (day of)
- ♦ Kids' Paddle (ages 7-12 only)
- Most Sailors (minimum of 3 sailors, all ages)

Basic Rules for Racing

- Be SAFE and have FUN!
- Minimum age of 7 to set sail alone
- All sailors MUST wear Coast Guard approved personal floatation devices. PLEASE BRING YOUR OWN!
- Registration release forms must be signed by participant, parent, or legal guardian over the age of 18
- No sharp objects on board vessels
- Any boat deemed unsafe to others (or to the river) will be disqualified
- Paint, if used, must be dry before launching. Water based paint only no oil based.
- Boats may be pre-built or built on-site. All boats will compete within the appropriate class.
- ◆ The "cabin" of the boat (where the crew sits) may not be enclosed above shoulder height.
- Boats, boat parts, and debris must be completely removed from the river and park.
- ◆ Crews must take recyclable boats with them. Cardboard boats can be taken home or be dropped off at the DPW truck in the parking lot for recycling after the race. Participants are responsible for proper disposal of their boats.

Please note: All sailors MUST PROVIDE THEIR OWN

Coast Guard approved personal floatation device.

Supplies and Materials:

Some materials will be available the day of for purchase. Feel free to bring your own from home, following the guidelines below!



NOT Okay Materials

No materials that will pollute the river

No staples

No sharp objects

No laminated, waxed, oiled, or peeled surfaces

No sono-tube

No foam, plastic, or rubber

No oil based paints



Okay Materials

- Plastic or wooden brooms
- Flat canoe paddles (no double/kayak or "scoop" paddles
- Cardboard (corrugated only) in any amount
- Caulk and/or glue
- Duct or paper tape in any amount
- Latex based paint
